

Registered 1990 - Culloden Baptist Church - Circa 1877



Construction of the Culloden Baptist Church was completed in 1877. It took two years to build under the direction of Deacon John Daley and John Ross. The men and women of Culloden worked very hard to help build the church. The timber for the church was donated by community members and milled into lumber at a sawmill on Hutchinson's Brook located on the Old Broad Cove Road. The timbers were hand hued and held together with wooden pegs through joints in the beams. The women held quilt sales and tea parties to help raise money for nails, shingles and extra lumber. The Culloden Baptist Church has several gothic architectural features. The steeply pitched roof and the modest cornerboards are common gothic elements. The heavy caps over the windows and front entrance are also strong indicators of the gothic theme. The church stands as a tribute to the hard work of our ancestors and as an historic landmark for the community of Culloden.
